### LOCAL RULES

1. **OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 27 - 1)**
  - a) Beyond any wall or fence.
  - b) On or over the roads adjacent to the 1st, 7th and 18th holes.
  - c) On the car parks or putting green.
  - d) When playing the 5th hole - the confines of the 17th hole as marked by white stakes.
2. **WATER HAZARDS (Rule 26)**
  - a) All drains and ditches whether marked or not.
  - b) Those hazards marked with red stakes are Lateral Water Hazards.
3. **EMBEDDED BALL - (Rule 25-2)**

A ball that is embedded in its own pitch mark in the ground through the green may be lifted, without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to where it lay but not nearer the hole.

**Exception -** A player may not obtain relief under this local rule if it is clearly unreasonable for the player to make a stroke because of anything other than the condition covered by this rule.
4. **OBSTRUCTIONS (RULE 24)**
  - a) **ROADS AND PATHS**  
All roads and paths on the course, including any confining artificial sides, will be classed as immovable obstructions and relief can be taken as per Rule 24(2)b.  
**Exception -** Relief cannot be taken if it is clearly unreasonable for the player to make the stroke because of anything other than the condition covered by this rule.
  - b) **YOUNG TREES**  
i) If a young tree (indicated either by a red tag or is staked) interferes with a player's stance or intended path of swing, the ball must be lifted without penalty and dropped in accordance with Rule 24(2)b (Immovable Obstruction).  
ii) If a ball comes to rest within an area marked with white stakes with 2 red stripes and if when addressing the ball a young tree interferes with the player's stance, intended path of swing or line of shot the ball may be lifted, cleaned and dropped within the confines of the staked area at the nearest point where any young tree would not interfere with the player's stance, intended line of swing or intended line of shot.
  - c) **SPRINKLER HEADS**  
Relief may be obtained from sprinkler heads under Rule 24-2. Additionally if a ball lies off the putting surface but not in a hazard, and a sprinkler head on or within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball, intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole the player may take relief as follows:  
The ball must be lifted and dropped at the nearest point where the ball lay so that:  
i) It is not nearer the hole.  
ii) It avoids intervention and  
iii) It is not in a hazard or on a putting green.  
The ball may be cleaned when lifted.  
If the ball lies on the putting green and a sprinkler head intervenes on the player's line of putt the player may take relief as follows:  
The ball must be lifted and placed at the nearest point where the ball lay so that:  
i) It is not nearer the hole,  
ii) It avoids intervention and  
iii) It is not in a hazard or on a putting green.
5. The stakes defining O.O.B. when playing the 5th hole are to be deemed immovable Obstructions during the play of the 17th hole and relief can be taken as per Rule 24(2)b.
6. A ball striking the overhead cable when playing the tee shot on the 13th hole MUST be replayed without penalty.
7. The tee shot on the 1st hole must not be played until the 1st green is clear.
8. The official starting points for the Course are the 1st and 10th tees.
9. **DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES**  
For all play at this course, with the exception of events where the competition regulations specifically prohibit their use, a player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. However, if, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g., gradient, wind-speed, temperature, etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.
